■ The Rad: Self-assured chic that lies somewhere

between androgyny and the New Romantics. It plays with movement and extreme lengths - copper shades become lighter towards the front of the head.

■ The Viv: Inspired by Debbie Harry, Vivienne Westwood and the roots of punk in the 1970s, it is a short, ultra blonde unconventional shape that focuses on movement.
